

Time to get ready for the annual pancake breakfast & do minor maintenance work in the building. Mark your calendars for Oct. 22 from 7am - noon!


- Our club went "Live" on Facebook for the first time during Sherrie Wilson's program.

The Hall of Honor was established to celebrate excellence & salute the contributions of individuals whose advancement of athletics in Duncanville ISD and beyond has made a profound difference in the lives of young people. Congrats Lions John & Janice!

Janice Savage-Martin

Janice (McJunkin) Savage-Martin graduated from DHS in 1971. She is the sixth generation of her maternal family to live in Duncanville. Janice has three sisters, one son, Brody, daughter-in-law Megan, and granddaughter Parker. She married Steve Martin in 2006.

Janice played basketball for Coach Sandra Meadows from 1968-1971 receiving All-District and letterman honors. Four generations of her family were Duncanville Pantherettes: her grandmother, mother, her niece as well as herself. Janice also lettered in track. In addition to her athletic abilities, she was selected Miss DHS, elected to Student Council Secretary and Treasurer positions and served in the National Honor Society.

Janice was chosen as Duncanville Woman of the Year in 2001 and has served on the Duncanville ISD Board of Trustees since 2012.

DISTRICT 2X-1 Announcement - Lions ALERT Program

Lions of District 2-X1,

The District Lions ALERT Program Chairpersons, John McGinnis and Roy Chirayil, met with the Dallas and Collin County Offices of Emergency Management (OEM) plus the City of Richardson to discuss where Lions can assist when a disaster occurs. We were asked by these jurisdictions to lead the charge for the planning, setup, and operation of a Volunteer Reception Center (VRC). This Center will greet, interview, register, assign, and track anyone who shows up to volunteer when disasters occur. Lions in the area of the disaster will be expected to immediately react when a disaster is declared in your City and execute the VRC setup and operations Plan (currently under development).

The District needs to find Lions who will be passionate and eager to accept the responsibility, which will be required when disaster hits the area, to start the setup process of the VRC. Of course these Lions will be trained and become well-versed on the actions required for their town, but first we need to know each Club can provide this Lion.

This is a great opportunity for all of us to get Lions in front of the local community and show them our leadership and abilities to be organized and ready to help in times of disaster. Please let your Club President know you are ready, willing, and able to be part of the District Lions ALERT team, so that we can start working with you on the training.

John Thompson

After retiring from the banking industry, John Thompson and his wife Martha created Green Tree Productions and began producing Duncanville Weekly News, a weekly TV show that focused on sports and the good news in Duncanville. Their slogan was "We Were There" because their plan was to cover every sporting event DHS played. John put his film to extra use by creating highlights of all the season's games and musical highlights for the team banquets. Parents could sit in the stands and enjoy watching their kids play knowing that John was there to record it all for their enjoyment for years to come.

Through the years, John has immortalized Duncanville's greatest athletes and coaches. He created a "History of the Pantherettes" video with the only footage of Coach Sandra Meadows sitting mid-court in the old gym talking about her great teams and their traditions. Half the proceeds from the sales were given to the Pantherette Exes Scholarship Foundation.
